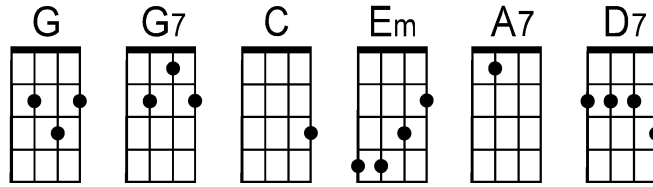


# “In the Good Old Summertime”
