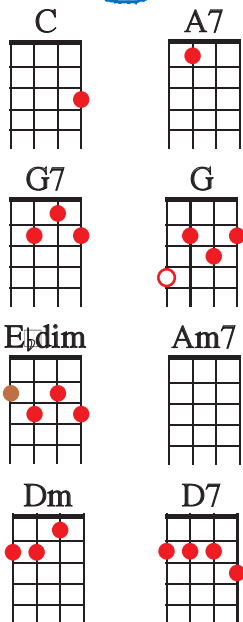


LET IT SNOW



"Let It Snow" was written by lyricist Sammy Cahn and composer Jule Styne in 1945 and first recorded by Vaughn Monroe, became a huge popular hit, reaching #1 on the Billboard music chart the following year.

Because of its seasonal lyrics, "Let It Snow" is often regarded as a Christmas song. Yet despite its cheery, holiday feel, it is actually just a wonderful winter love song that never mentions any holiday. One of the best-selling songs of all time, "Let It Snow" has been covered countless times, with recordings by such wildly varied artists as the following: Herb Alpert & the Tijuana Brass, Ed Ames, Boyz II Men, Chicago, Patsy Cline, Judy Collins, Ray Conniff Singers, Bing Crosby, Doris Day, Gloria Estefan, Kenny G, Vince Gill, Chris Isaak, The Manhattan Transfer, Dean Martin, Johnny Mathis, Martina McBride, Jo Dee Messina, Aaron Neville, Leon Redbone, Marie Osmond, Cliff Richard, Carly Simon, Jessica Simpson, Frank Sinatra, Twisted Sister, Jaci Velasquez and Andy Williams.
