Give thanks and praise to the Lord and I will feel alright

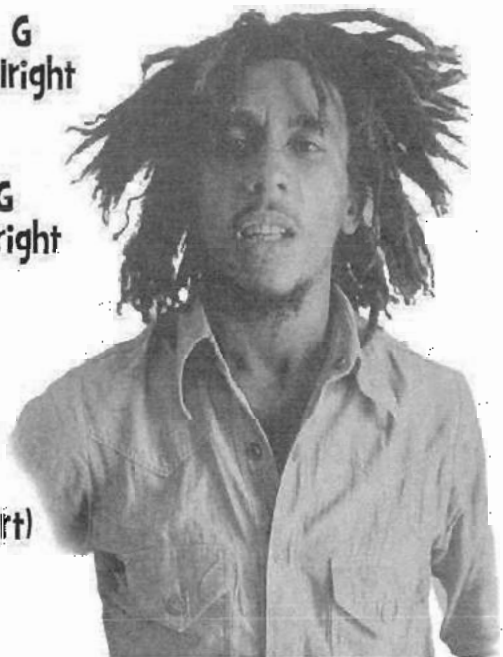

The song contains an interpretation of The Impressions' song "People Get Ready" written by Curtis Mayfield. The original recording of the song is simply titled "One Love" and does not credit Mayfield. But when the famous version was recorded in 1977 it was titled "One Love/People Get Ready" and gives co-authorship credits to both Marley and Mayfield.
